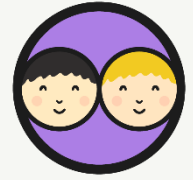

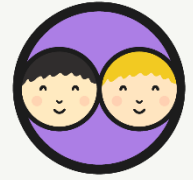
# What Do We Use the Internet For?

# Staying Safe Online



Some people might think that using a computer can't be dangerous.

Most of the time there is no danger but sometimes we might see things on the Internet that worry us or make us feel uncomfortable.

# Staying Safe Online



Using the Internet with an adult is the best way to be safe online.



They can check that the websites you are using are right for someone your age and you can tell them if you see something you are unhappy or unsure about.

Always ask a grown-up before going online.

# Staying Safe Online



The Internet can be a great place for learning but we need to be careful at school that we only use the websites our teacher has told us to use.

If we see something we are worried about we should tell our teacher straight away.



# Keep It Private!



One of the most important things we need to remember when we are using the Internet is to keep our **personal data** private.



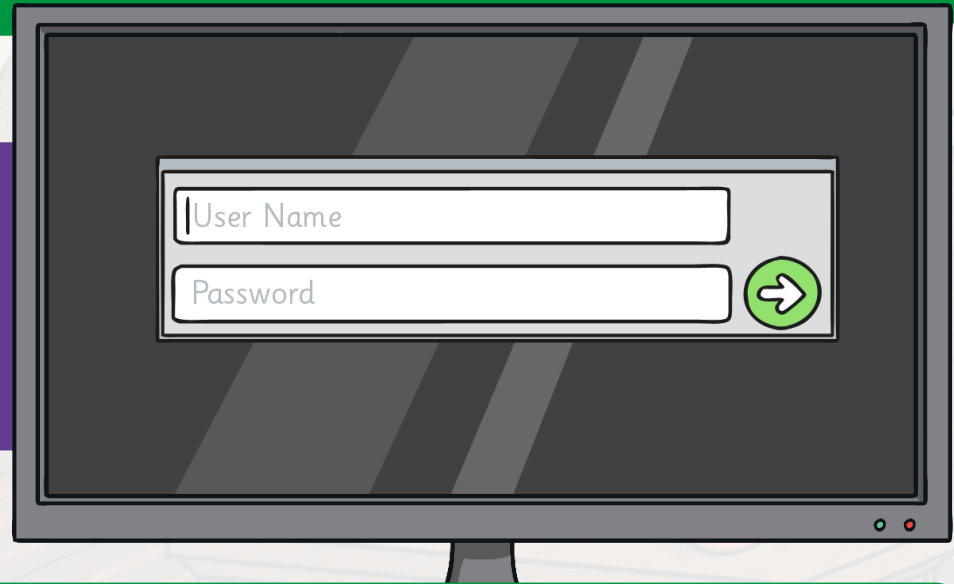
**Personal data** is information about ourselves, such as our name, our address and where we go to school.

# Keep It Private!



Just as we wouldn't tell a stranger in the street or at the park our personal information, we don't want strangers online to know this information.

We **never** give our address or say which school we go to when we are using the Internet.



We also keep our passwords secret so other people cannot put our information online.
